1. Prerana Setu online education program

We completed a year-long project, entitled *Prerana Setu* (Bridge of Motivation), in collaboration with Jnana Prabodhini's Educational Activities and Research Center, Pune, India. In a series of 25 online sessions, members from a diverse pool of professions and with a wide range of expertise interacted with over 100 high school students from two schools in the state of Maharashtra, India.

2. JPF at BMM's 2019 convention

Prasad Panwalker (Vice President of JPF), and Vidya Hardikar-Sapre (Treasurer of JPF) represented Jnana Prabodhini at the biannual convention of Bruhan Maharashtra Mandal of North America held in Dallas, Texas on July 11-14, 2019. A senior psychologist and the former head of Jnana Prabodhini's Institute of Psychology, Dr. Vanita Patwardhan was present at the promotional booth and participated in fundraising efforts.



3. Fundraising initiatives

We organized a fundraiser on the occasion of the golden jubilee celebrations of Jnana Prabodhini Prashala, Pune in June 2019. Through individual donations and corporate matching funds, we raised over \$17,000 to support Jnana Prabodhini's work in India. We disbursed \$14,045 to various initiatives including a laser cutting machine at Jnana Prabodhini Prashala in Pune, infrastructure development at Jnana Prabodhini Nigdi, and *Nav Disha* women leadership program in the Velhe block of Pune district. We thank our generous donors. Currently, we are organizing a fundraiser to respond to the COVID-19 situation. We appeal to you to be a part of this relief work.

4. Global coordination meetings

Twenty coordinators are leading a global networking initiative to bring together Jnana Prabodhini affiliates and sign up new members in the USA, Canada, the UK, Europe, the Middle East, and Oceania (Australia and New Zealand). Through 12 regional chapters, these coordinators have brought together over 450 to 500 members living abroad. The regional chapters act as platforms to come together for a greater social cause and help each other through various supports such as those needed in the trying times of COVID-19. The coordinators meet virtually for a bi-monthly meeting. In the past four meetings, Prof. Subhashrao Deshpande (Secretary, Jnana Prabodhini), Dr. Girishrao Bapat (Director, Jnana Prabodhini), and Prof. Suvarna Gondhalekar (Head, Jnana Prabodhini Rural Women Leadership Wing) guided us on building a global Jnana Prabodhini community.



5. Meetings in India

JPF representatives visited India on the occasion of Jnana Prabodhini Prashala's golden jubilee event in Pune on December 22, 2019. We met with senior officials of Jnana Prabodhini and discussed JPF's plans. The announcement of JPF's formation was made at the massive gathering of 1500 alumni.





6. Chapter meets

Regional chapters organized in-person and virtual meetups in the past 15 months on various occasions. These include in-person meets in San Fransisco Bay Area, Chicago, Seattle, New York, Boston, Greater Raleigh Area, Berlin, Sydney, Dubai, and Pune. Additionally, JP-South chapter twice organized virtual meetups. Over 125 members attended these events.
